Review of Literature

Imran, M.M., & Nguyen, N.T.B. (2018) emphasizes that households in Khurpatal village, located in the Nainital district of Uttarakhand, have not experienced significant economic gains from the tourism industry. This lack of economic benefit may be attributed to the limited involvement of the community in tourism development efforts. Furthermore, the majority of villagers believe that implementing a home-stay program could generate employment opportunities and enhance the local community's income.

Jayara, J. S. (2017). Highlights that home-stays in Uttarakhand offer a distinctive chance to foster sustainable tourism by utilizing local resources, existing infrastructure, and natural surroundings. It underscores the importance of examining this emerging tourism model from the viewpoints of tourists, the local community, and policymakers. Active involvement and engagement of

communities are crucial for addressing constraints associated with home-stay operations.

Kala, D., & Bagri, S. C. (2018). states that there are four primary obstacles impacting community engagement in tourism development namely practical, socio-cultural, apprehension, and institutional barriers. It stresses the importance of advocating for increased community involvement, enhancing coordination among relevant government bodies, providing education and training for local residents, and devising tailored strategies to promote local participation in accordance with the unique characteristics of each destination.

Ibrahim, Y., & Razzaq, A. R. A. (2010). The study highlights the rise in homestay providers in Malaysia due to the program's potential to offer extra income and employment opportunities. The increasing demand reflects global shifts toward heightened interest in cultural heritage, lifestyles, and environmental awareness. This underscores the importance of prioritizing resource allocation to Community-Based Tourism programs, which can distribute benefits widely and revitalize rural economies.

Jamal, S. A., Othman, N. A., & Muhammad, N. M. N. (2011). The study suggests that the perceived value of community-based homestay tourism is influenced by functional, emotional, and experiential factors. It recommends that host providers, marketers, and governments prioritize these dimensions of value to enhance the overall tourist experience and to refine strategies for positioning and promoting this specific tourism niche.

Jamal, S. A., Othman, N. A., & Muhammad, N. M. N. (2011). Tourist perceived value in a community-based homestay visit: An investigation into the functional and experiential aspect of value.

CASE STUDIES BASED ON COMMUNITY HOMESTAY MODEL OF UTTARAKHAND

- **BeenThereDoonThat Homestays Community Programme** – The concept of homestays emerged from the principles of slow travel and walking tourism, aiming to foster authentic cultural experiences while preserving local heritage and ecosystems. This initiative, initiated several years ago, initially involved organizing heritage walks to remote villages. It was a response to the detrimental impacts of mass tourism, which many communities have unfortunately experienced first-hand. To ensure the success of homestays as

genuine representations of distinct micro-cultures, communities are encouraged to refrain from altering their traditional homes. The program focuses on collaborating with communities located away from major highways, accessible via short walking trails. Key elements include preserving local architecture and fostering a community commitment to sustainable and leisurely tourism practices. These villages often serve as starting points for treks and hikes, and we empower local youth to lead these excursions. For instance, in the Garhwal region, villages like Bhangeli and Devalsari offer heritage walks as well as specialized trails focusing on nature observation, such as moth, bird, fern, and butterfly trails. Engaging locals in interpreting and maintaining these trails instils a sense of pride and responsibility in safeguarding their natural heritage. Visitors are encouraged to participate in community activities, such as tending fields or herding sheep, alongside sampling local cuisine and partaking in village rituals. Camping is discouraged in favour of staying in "chanis" or small village homes amidst fields, or in huts belonging to transhumant Gujars. This approach ensures a deeper immersion into the local way of life and minimizes the intrusion of modern conveniences. Experiencing the unhurried rhythm of community life and the absence of individualism often leads visitors to return home transformed. This transformation lies at the heart of a successful homestay experience, where connections between people and places are forged in a meaningful and sustainable manner. (OT Staff, 2024)

- **Sarmoli Homestay** - *The management of Sarmoli homestays falls under the jurisdiction of the Maati Sangathan, a self-help group deeply committed to safeguarding the region's forests and preserving its natural resources. In addition to their environmental endeavours, the group actively tackles pressing social issues, including domestic violence, within the community. This holistic approach to community development underscores their dedication to fostering a sustainable and harmonious way of life. Collaborating with the Maati Sangathan, Himalayan Ark facilitates environmentally-conscious treks led by knowledgeable local guides. These treks not only showcase the breath-taking beauty of the Himalayan landscape but also promote responsible tourism practices that prioritize conservation and respect for the local environment. Through their efforts, Sarmoli homestays serve as a shining example of community-based tourism in Uttarakhand, embodying the principles of environmental stewardship and social responsibility.* (Nath, S.2021)
- **The Goat Village** - The Goat Village offers a unique experience by immersing travelers in the serene ambiance of traditional Kumaoni-style houses, where they are warmly welcomed by dedicated volunteers and local staff. Amidst this rustic setting, a greenhouse serves as a hub for innovative experimentation in organic farming techniques and the cultivation of high-value crops. The overarching goal is to revitalize abandoned lands and empower local farmers economically. Embracing sustainability, the village champions the production of organic crops such as amaranth and finger millets, sourced directly from local farmers. These wholesome offerings, bearing the signature Bakri Chhap brand, find their way to stores in bustling urban centres like Dehradun and Delhi, showcasing the richness of

Uttarakhand's agricultural heritage. Although not strictly categorized as a conventional homestay, the Goat Village promises an enriching rural retreat, providing visitors with an intimate glimpse into the rhythms of village life. Surrounded by unparalleled natural beauty, it stands as an exemplar of responsible tourism in Uttarakhand, offering a harmonious blend of cultural immersion and environmental stewardship. (Nath, S.2021)

- **SEWA Atithi** – SEWA Atithi is a pioneering initiative led by women in Uttarakhand, India, aimed at establishing a community-based homestay collective. This social enterprise endeavors to provide an authentic mountain experience to visitors while empowering local women as hosts. With around 15 homestay owners, primarily farmers, the collective operates in two picturesque locations: Basoli Gav in Almora and Kandara Gav in Rudraprayag, both offering immersive village experiences. Located approximately 360 km from the state capital Dehradun, Basoli Gav is nestled in the scenic surroundings of Almora, a cantonment town. Meanwhile, Kandara Gav, situated near the convergence of the Alakananda and Mandakini rivers in Rudraprayag, offers a tranquil setting for travellers seeking a genuine rural encounter. In addition to accommodation, SEWA Atithi aims to provide a range of locally embedded services, facilitating authentic village exploration for guests. Extensive training and skill development programs have been organized for village women, equipping them to effectively manage homestays and serve as knowledgeable tour guides. Through this initiative, SEWA Atithi not only promotes sustainable tourism but also fosters economic empowerment and skill enhancement among rural women. (Anupriya, May 1, 2023)
- **Basa Homestay Model, Pauri Garhwal** - Under the leadership of District Magistrate Dhiraj Singh Garbyal, innovative community-centered development strategies have transformed perceptions and provided residents of Pauri Garhwal with a promising future. One such initiative is the Basa model, a unique homestay concept tailored to bolster the district's tourism industry and revitalize the local economy. Basa cottages, which encourage locals to open their homes to guests, have been particularly successful in Pauri. The Basa tourism center in Khirsu, situated 1,700 meters above sea level and approximately 11 km from Pauri, exemplifies this approach. Designed to withstand the cold temperate climate, Basa cottages feature sturdy gabion retaining walls at the base and lightweight wooden structures on top, clad with wattle and daub panels. Originally conceived as an entry for an earthquake-resistant housing competition, the project was repurposed to promote tourism and stimulate the village economy. Innovatively, Basa operates as a tourism-based economic model, eschewing traditional subsidies or loans for hotel-style accommodations. Instead, the government supports the creation of homestays through collective participation. These homestays are managed by women self-help groups (SHGs), which receive training in hospitality management and local cuisine preparation. The success of these homestays is evident, with families earning up to Rs 2,000 per booking, transforming the concept into a sustainable way of life for many. The holistic development approach of Basa extends beyond tourism, fostering activities such as farming, horticulture, and animal husbandry. By integrating these

aspects, the Basa model not only boosts tourism but also promotes overall economic growth and community well-being in the region. (Upadhyay, V. 2020)

PROSPECTS OF COMMUNITY HOMESTAY MODELS IN UTTARAKHAND:

- **Preservation of Culture and Heritage:** Community homestays offer tourists a chance to fully engage with the local culture and traditions of Uttarakhand, fostering a deeper appreciation for and conservation of the area's cultural legacy. (Chakraborty, B. 2020)
- **Economic Empowerment of Local Communities:** Engaging in community homestay programs enables local communities to generate supplementary income, diminishing reliance on conventional livelihoods like agriculture. This economic empowerment holds the potential to alleviate poverty and foster broader socio-economic advancement in rural regions of Uttarakhand. (Abdullah, N. C. & Said, J. 2014)
- **Diversification of Tourism Offerings:** Community homestays provide a distinct lodging choice compared to hotels and resorts, broadening the array of tourism options available in Uttarakhand. This has the potential to draw in a new demographic of travelers in search of genuine and immersive experiences, consequently enlarging the tourism sector within the region. (Purnomo, A., Wiradimadja, A., & Kurniawan, B., 2019)
- **Sustainable Tourism Development:** In contrast to traditional tourism accommodations, community homestays frequently adopt sustainable measures like waste management, energy conservation, and support for local handicrafts. This commitment to sustainable tourism principles not only fosters the longevity of tourism in Uttarakhand but also mitigates adverse environmental effects. (Lama, M. 2013)
- **Enhanced Local Participation and Ownership:** Community homestay models promote the enthusiastic engagement and participation of local residents in tourism development endeavours. This cultivates a sense of responsibility and esteem within the community, resulting in improved conservation of natural resources and enhanced collaboration in tourism management initiatives. (Hussin, R. 2008)
- **Cultural Exchange and Cross-Cultural Understanding:** Community homestays enable authentic interactions between tourists and local residents, nurturing cross-cultural exchange and comprehension. Tourists gain insights into the customs, traditions, and lifestyle of the local communities, while residents are exposed to diverse cultures and viewpoints, fostering mutual understanding and appreciation.
- **Promotion of Rural Tourism:** Community homestays are commonly situated in rural and less-traveled regions, providing tourists with the opportunity to discover lesser-known destinations in Uttarakhand. This encourages the growth of rural tourism, distributing visitor traffic away from heavily congested tourist hubs and fostering more balanced regional development across the state.
- **Support for Artisans and Local Entrepreneurs:** Community homestays often collaborate with local artisans and entrepreneurs to offer authentic experiences such as handicraft workshops, traditional cuisine, and guided nature walks. This provides additional income opportunities for

artisans and entrepreneurs, preserves traditional craftsmanship, and promotes local products.

- **Flexibility and Adaptability:** Community homestay models can be tailored to suit the specific needs and preferences of both tourists and local communities. This flexibility allows for experimentation with different approaches and the adaptation of the model to changing market trends and socio-economic conditions in Uttarakhand.
- **Government Support and Policy Impetus:** The government of Uttarakhand and various tourism authorities have recognized the potential of community homestays in promoting sustainable tourism and rural development. Supportive policies, incentives, and capacity-building initiatives are being implemented to encourage the growth of community-based tourism initiatives, further enhancing the prospects of community homestay models in the state.

CHALLENGES OF COMMUNITY HOMESTAY MODELS IN UTTARAKHAND:

- **Limited Awareness and Market Penetration:** One of the significant challenges is the limited awareness of community homestays among potential tourists. Many travellers may not be familiar with this accommodation option, leading to low market penetration and occupancy rates for homestay owners.
- **Infrastructure and Connectivity:** Remote locations where community homestays are often situated may lack adequate infrastructure and connectivity, including roads, transportation facilities, and internet access. This hampers accessibility for tourists and affects the overall guest experience.
- **Seasonal Nature of Tourism:** Uttarakhand experiences distinct tourist seasons, with peaks during summer and monsoon due to pilgrimage and adventure tourism. However, community homestays may struggle to attract guests during off-peak seasons, leading to income instability for homestay operators.
- **Regulatory and Permitting Challenges:** Navigating regulatory frameworks and obtaining necessary permits and licenses for operating community homestays can be complex and time-consuming. Ambiguities in land-use regulations and bureaucratic hurdles pose significant obstacles to the establishment and expansion of homestay initiatives.
- **Quality Standards and Training:** Ensuring consistent quality standards across community homestays is essential for guest satisfaction and positive reviews. However, there may be a lack of standardized training programs and support mechanisms for homestay owners to enhance their hospitality skills and maintain service quality.
- **Competition from Established Accommodations:** Community homestays often compete with established hotels, resorts, and guesthouses in Uttarakhand. Limited differentiation and marketing resources may make it challenging for homestays to attract tourists and compete effectively in the tourism market.
- **Socio-Cultural Sensitivity:** Balancing tourism development with the preservation of local culture and traditions is crucial for the sustainability of community homestays. Ensuring that tourism activities respect the cultural norms and values of host communities requires sensitivity and proactive engagement with local stakeholders.

- **Financial Sustainability:** Securing initial investment and accessing financial resources for infrastructure development and marketing can be daunting for community homestay initiatives, especially in rural areas with limited access to credit facilities and investment capital.
- **Environmental Conservation:** Sustainable management of natural resources and minimizing the environmental footprint of tourism activities are paramount for the long-term viability of community homestays. However, inadequate waste management practices and ecosystem degradation pose challenges to environmental conservation efforts.
- **Community Engagement and Empowerment:** Engaging and empowering local communities in the decision-making process and ensuring equitable distribution of benefits from tourism activities are critical challenges. Addressing issues of social exclusion, fostering community ownership, and promoting inclusive development are essential for building resilient and sustainable homestay models in Uttarakhand.

SUGGESTIONS TO DEVELOP COMMUNITY BASED HOMESTAY MODELS IN UTTARAKHAND

- **Community Participation and Ownership:** Encourage active involvement of local communities in all stages of homestay development, from planning and decision-making to management and promotion. Foster a sense of ownership and pride among community members by involving them in the design and operation of homestay initiatives.
- **Capacity Building and Training:** Provide training and capacity-building programs for homestay owners and community members to enhance their hospitality skills, including customer service, hygiene standards, and marketing techniques. Offer workshops, seminars, and skill development sessions to improve the overall quality of homestay experiences.
- **Infrastructure Development:** Invest in improving basic infrastructure and amenities in rural areas where community homestays are located. Focus on enhancing road connectivity, water supply, sanitation facilities, and electricity access to ensure a comfortable and convenient stay for guests.
- **Marketing and Promotion:** Develop comprehensive marketing strategies to increase awareness and visibility of community homestays among potential tourists. Utilize online platforms, social media, tourism websites, and collaboration with travel agencies to reach a broader audience and attract visitors to Uttarakhand.
- **Quality Assurance Mechanisms:** Establish quality standards and certification programs for community homestays to ensure consistent service delivery and guest satisfaction. Implement regular inspections, feedback mechanisms, and training programs to maintain high standards of cleanliness, comfort, and hospitality.
- **Cultural Immersion Experiences:** Promote authentic cultural experiences and interactions between guests and local communities to differentiate community homestays from traditional accommodations. Organize cultural events, heritage walks, storytelling sessions, and traditional music and dance performances to enrich the guest experience.
- **Diversification of Offerings:** Expand the range of activities and experiences offered at community homestays to cater to diverse interests and preferences of tourists. Include adventure

activities, eco-tours, wellness retreats, culinary experiences, and handicraft workshops to appeal to a broader audience.

- **Collaboration and Networking:** Foster collaboration and networking among homestay owners, local businesses, government agencies, NGOs, and tourism stakeholders to leverage resources, share best practices, and address common challenges. Establish partnerships for joint marketing campaigns, product development, and capacity-building initiatives.
- **Sustainable Practices:** Promote sustainable tourism practices and environmental conservation initiatives within community homestays. Implement waste management systems, water conservation measures, renewable energy technologies, and eco-friendly construction methods to minimize the environmental impact of tourism activities.
- **Policy Support and Incentives:** Advocate for supportive policies, incentives, and regulatory frameworks to facilitate the development and growth of community-based tourism initiatives in Uttarakhand. Work closely with government agencies and policymakers to address legal and administrative barriers and create an enabling environment for community homestays to thrive.

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
